I write this report after another 'interesting' year precipitated by the pandemic! The return to lockdown after holding the initial winter 2 galas of the newly named 'Vasbyt' Swim series in April and May, meant that we could only resume the schedule in August so the schedule went as follows:

With the shutting down of Ellis Park due to the town council allocating no funds for repairs and maintenance of pool pumps and heating systems and St Stithians closing their pool so that it could be converted into a FINA approved facility we were forced to look alternative LC venues. The long course galas were held at Reddam House in Waterfall (29-2-22) and Wits University main campus pool.

St Stithians School have had a formal request from GMS to consider being the host pool for the 2024 SAMS LC Champs.
